

COURSE OUTLINE - MANICURE 600 HOURS

COURSE TITLE

Manicure

This course is 150 hours longer than the minimum standards required by the State of Indiana. The added hours enhance the minimum curriculum, required by the State of Indiana. The additional subjects include, but are not limited to essential oils, advanced massage, advanced artificial nails and spa studies. The job descriptions required by the employer are more demanding than what is required in a basic 450 hour program.

This course includes free employment assistance and includes, but is not limited to classes/Career Path in professionalism, resume development, interview preparation, and job search skills.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is divided into two levels of study. The **first level, 0 - 300 hours**, presents an introduction to manicuring/pedicuring. The student will learn the basic skills of manicuring and pedicuring, while the **second level, 301-600 hours**, introduces the student to artificial nail techniques and the lab area. Additionally it provides the student with the opportunity to practice all skills in the lab area. This level will include theories, various techniques, and procedures for those skills preferred when working in a day spa.

All levels of training provide theory lectures/demonstrations.

COURSE OBJECTIVES/GOALS

The goal of the manicuring course is to provide the learner with the opportunity to obtain their manicure license and to enter the job market with entry level skills.

PROJECTS/ASSIGNMENTS

The student must complete the Indiana Progress Book and any independent assignments given during classroom activity.

The student's progress during each of the three levels of training is evaluated quantitatively. The following is the list of required MINIMUM assignments:

0 - 300 Hours 75 Assignments

351 - 600 Hours 288 Assignments/Defined at time of class

EVALUATION/GRADING

Theory exams are given weekly. Pre-state evaluations are given at 300 and 550 hours.

A cumulative score comprised of attendance, weekly theory exams, quantitative assignment completion and applicable practical evaluations are used to determine satisfactory progress throughout the course.

GRADUATION EVALUATION

All assignments, projects, tests, and hours must be completed before the student is eligible for graduation. School finals completed with a minimum score of 80% enable the student to file for their licensing exam.

ATTENDANCE

The maximum time frame for course completion is 150%. To complete the course within the contractual obligations, the student must attend class 90% of the time. Students will be billed for hours/work required beyond the terms of their enrollment contract.
