COURSE OUTLINE - BARBER 1500 HOURS

COURSE TITLE

Barbering

The course meets the minimum standard required by the State of Indiana.

This course includes free employment assistance and includes but is not limited to classes/Career Path in professionalism, resume development, interview preparation, and job search skills.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is divided into four levels of study. During the **first 450 hours**, the student will learn the basic skills of facials, scalp treatments, introduction to shaving, chemical application, and haircutting/ designing techniques. While in the **second level**, **451-900 hours**, the student is introduced to the lab. This level allows the student to practice the skills acquired during the first 450 hours of training. The **third level**, **901-1200 hours**, enables the student to perform the skills acquired during first and second level. At this time, the student will have the opportunity to expand their education in color formulation as well as cutting, shaving and designing concepts. **The fourth level**, **1201-1500 hours**, begins the preparation process needed to prepare for the licensing exam as well as the professional world of employment. All levels of training provide theory lectures/demonstrations.

COURSE OBJECTIVES/GOALS

The goal of the barbering course is to provide the learner with the opportunity to obtain their barbering license and to enter the job market with entry level employment skills.

PROJECTS/ASSIGNMENTS

The student must complete the Indiana Progress Book and any independent assignments given during classroom activity.

The student's progress during each of the four levels of training is evaluated quantitatively. The following is a list of required MINIMUM assignments.

EVALUATION/GRADING

Theory exams are given weekly. Pre state evaluations are given at 450, 900, 1200 and 1500 hours.

A cumulative score composed of attendance, weekly theory exams, quantitative assignment completion and applicable practical evaluations are used to determine satisfactory progress throughout the course. A minimum standard of 80% is required.

GRADUATION EVALUATION

All assignments, projects, tests, and hours must be completed before the student is eligible for graduation. School finals completed with a minimum score of 80% enable the student to file for their licensing exam.

ATTENDANCE
